With breathtaking caldera views, fabulous spas and spectacular infinity pools, the boutique hotels in Santorini are amongst the best in Greece. Some hotels have award-winning chefs or top-notch baristas, others have resident DJs or rooms with river pools. The architecture itself is worth an Instagram snap or two: think dwellings carved out of *kanaves* (underground cellars) once used for storing wine, stylishly renovated caves where locals once resided to escape the heat, and monastic estates with the most terrific views. Whether you're seeking a romantic haven or more of a traditional vibe, this volcanic island has something for every taste; here's our pick of the best boutique hotels in Santorini.



Andronis Boutique Hotel

Santorini, Greece

Peace and calm prevail in this caldera-side hotel in the heart of Oia. The style is simple and wonderfully soothing, with everything focused on the spectacular panoramic views of the sparkling Aegean, caldera islands and most of the crescent of Santorini. There's a small heated infinity pool while a larger, deeper pool is surrounded by sunbeds-with-a-view before they are replaced with additional tables for the hotel's Lauda restaurant. The 24 Cave Suites are cut into the rocky caldera cliff and come with a charming little terrace. Some have plunge pools or whirlpool tubs.
