## The Best Hotels In Santorini For 2022

— There's more to the Greek isle than sunsets - namely, stylish Santorini hotels

The Greek island is the world's undisputed champion of sunset spying – and also home to some *seriously* stylish Santorini hotels (from which to watch the sun go down, obviously).

The Cyclades may span hundreds of different islands, but few get more footfall than Santorini and Mykonos, and with just one glimpse of Santorini's famous volcanic caldera from along its croissant-shaped coastline, it won't take you long to see why. Whitewashed, cave-like suites are the standard here, but the island also has some more colourful hotels, many of which still focus, unsurprisingly, on sourcing the prime position for sunset.

Andronis Arcadia at the northern tip of the island has individual, plunge-pool-enhanced suites, for straight-to-your-terrace sunset perfection – along with an amazing sushi bar for poolside lunches that beat a club sandwich.

Down at the black-sand shores of Perivolos, <u>Istoria</u> tells a tale with former-stable suites, a creative restaurant and the beach (and beach clubs) on your doorstep.

The cruise liners may drop anchor for a certain time of day, but the island has plenty to keep its many visitors entertained while the sun's up, too: there's the archaeological site of Akrotiri, the caldera-edge town of Oia for blue-dome-church hunting and volcanic beaches.

## Andronis Arcadia, Oia



On Santorini's sunset-ready northernmost tip, <u>Andronis Arcadia</u> gives guests exclusive access to the dazzling nightly show that the coach-loads are lined up outside to catch – with a private terrace and plunge pool to make it even better.

Laid-back lunches of intricate sushi and gourmet burgers are served poolside and in the restaurant, or you can splash out on a fine-dining meal at Opson (with the sky still lit up from the fiery sunset), which has a resident culinary archaeologist spilling the beans on the dining habits of the Ancient Greeks. The spa has a sea-facing hammock, complete with billowy curtains, to snooze in post-treatment.
