7. Santorini, Greece

Rivalling Mykonos for its cosmopolitan edge, <u>Santorini</u> is perhaps the most recognisable Greek island of them all. Its white-painted villages and blue-domed churches gaze down at the cobalt Aegean from the sweeping rim of an ancient volcanic crater — the remnants of a cataclysmic eruption some 3,500 years ago. Of its villages, Oia is the go-to spot for sunsets (if you can handle the crowds), Fira is brilliant for clubs, bars and restaurants, and Imerovigli is more chilled out. Take in all three with a lovely hike along the crater's-edge footpath. Andronis Concept is a sea-facing spa retreat in Imerovigli where all rooms have private terraces and plunge pools.
