## The best hotels in Paros, Greece for 2025

It's one of the best-kept secrets among the Greek Islands, and certainly the Cycladics. But a surge of design-led hotel openings is putting Paros firmly on the map

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Paros is an [island](#) that has been known and loved by Greeks for years, and some of the best hotels in Paros have remained (just about) under the international tourism radar – until fairly recently. Now an increasingly popular place to visit with Greeks and non-Greeks alike, it seems the secret is out.

Why the recent surge in popularity? A string of new luxury and boutique hotels has opened over the last few years and play a big part in the island’s global recognition, as does its cameo in the recent Netflix series, *'One Day'*.

Despite its proximity to [Mykonos](#) – around 45 minutes by ferry – [Paros](#) is not anywhere near as crowded as its perennially popular neighbour (yet), instead offering a laid-back retreat spread across small villages and sandy beaches with sparkling blue seas. You’ll find the quietest beaches in the south and the most traditional [villages](#) inland. But there’s a buzz here too: if it’s hip bars and restaurants that you’re after, head to trendy Naoussa. These are the best hotels in Paros, whether you’re visiting for secluded downtime and untouched sands, or looking for easy access to some of the island’s most coveted beach bars and top [restaurants](#). ## Andronis Minois

Already owners of four hotels in Santorini, family-run Andronis Hotels opened their first property in Paros in 2024, following an extensive renovation of an already established island hotel close to Parasporos Bay. Exteriors at the newly refreshed hotel – a member of Small Luxury Hotels of the World – reflect the traditional, cubic and whitewashed architecture principles found across much of the Cyclades, but the hotel stands out for its custom-curated, locally made interior elements; assorted tiling, block-print cushions, latticed room dividers and hand-spun ceramics. Well, that and the sea views from many of the 44 suites – all of which come with outdoor spaces, some with private pools. Rooms are centred around a main pool, which is where you'll find guests soaking up the Greek sun by day. Come evening, the action moves to Olvo restaurant, headed by Greek chef Anastasios Tsantilas, who has curated a modern-Greek dining experience featuring dishes including fava beans with chorizo, taramas with bottarga powder, pastas with lobster or eel, and plenty of meat and fish.
